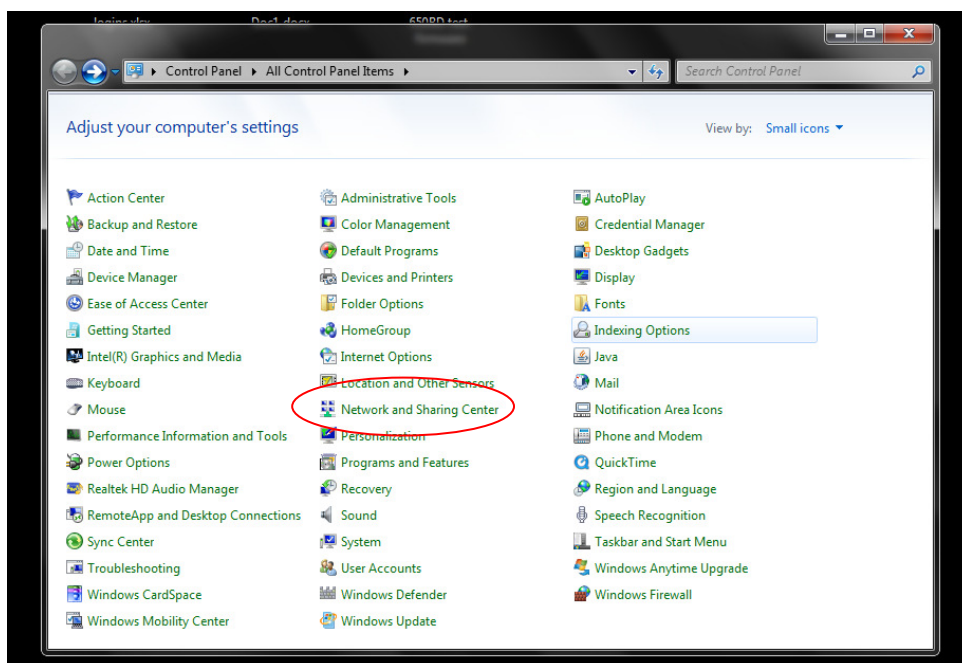
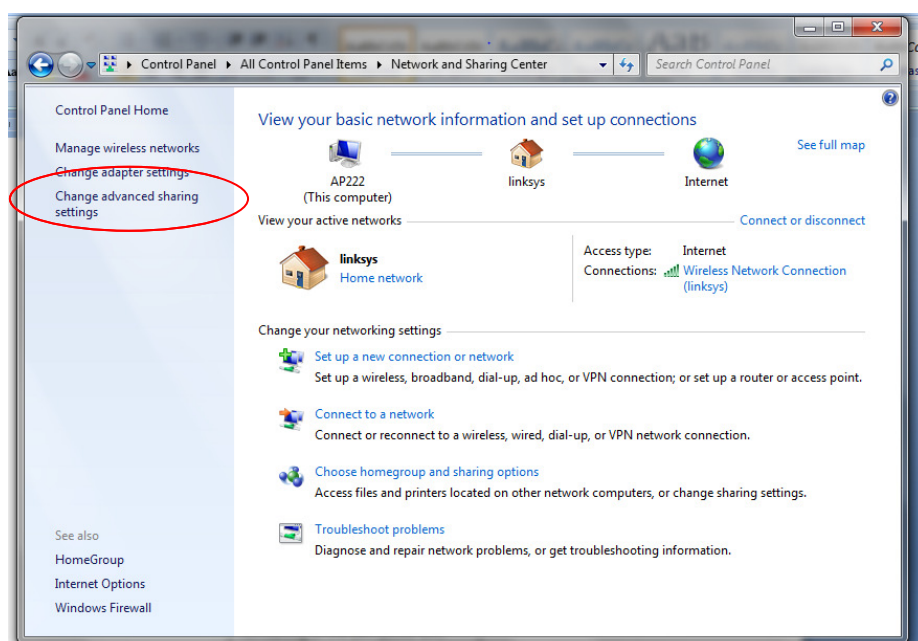


### To enable UPnP playback from your Windows 7 PC...

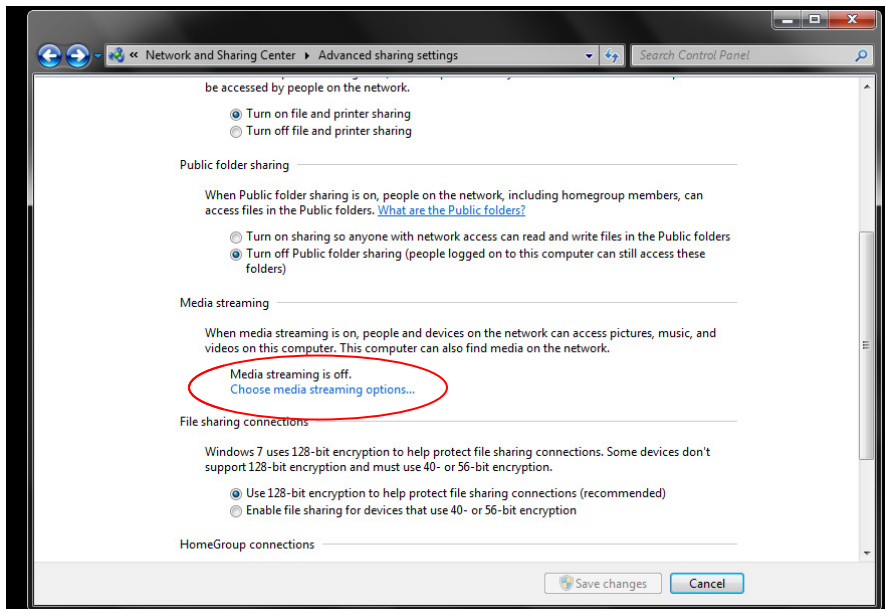
1. Within in Control Panel open 'Network and Sharing Centre'.



2. Select 'Change advanced sharing settings' by clicking the link on the left hand side of the window.



3. Under the 'Home or Work' profile, scroll down to 'Media streaming' and select 'Choose media streaming options'.



4. Click 'Turn on media streaming'.

### Choose media streaming options for computers and devices

#### Media streaming is not turned on

Media streaming allows you to send your music, pictures and videos to other computers and devices on your network. It also allows you to receive media from other computers and devices.

If you turn on media streaming, your current network profile and firewall settings will be modified. You should turn on media streaming only on networks that you trust, such as home or work networks.

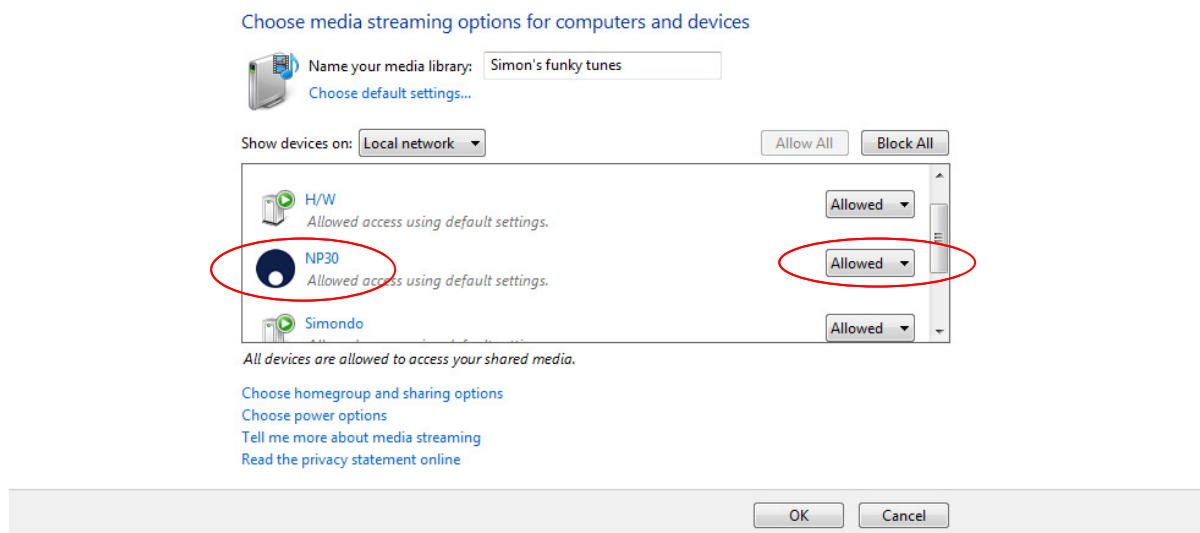

## Set-up guide

5. After you turn on media streaming, a list of your networked devices will appear. Make sure that Stream Magic product is 'Allowed' in the check box next to its icon.



6. Click OK to exit.

Now, in the Stream Magic product's 'Media' menu, the Windows 7 computer will be seen (as whatever name you have given your media library) when you scan for UPnP servers.

This now uses Windows built-in UPnP server. Windows' UPnP server works with most file formats, but it is worth noting that it is not compatible with FLAC files for example, and will not serve them to the NP30.

If you do not wish to use Windows UPnP server, or you specifically want to play FLAC files over the network, then you will need to manually install third-party UPnP software (such as Asset or Twonky) to do the job instead of carrying out the steps above. Please see the software provider for installation instructions.
